Dr. Catherine Michaud, CSJ

Catherine Michaud, CSJ, a Sister of St. Joseph of Concordia, Kansas, is a systematic theologian whose doctoral specialties are ecclesiology and the theology of the Holy Spirit. She received the Licentiate in Sacred Theology (STL) from Regis College (Toronto) in 1993 followed by her PhD in Systematic Theology from the Toronto School of Theology of the University of Toronto. Her dissertation is entitled *Pneumatology in Vatican Council II: Forward Steps and Open Questions*. She has been a professor of theology and Christian spirituality for over 25 years; for seven of those years she was the director of the M.A. Program in Theology at St. Catherine University in St. Paul, Minnesota. Having trained with the Jesuits in spiritual direction and retreat work, she served briefly in the 70s as director of her religious congregation's retreat center in Kansas. She is now engaged in research, writing, spiritual direction, retreat work, and giving public lectures in her areas of specialty, Vatican Council II and the Holy Spirit.
