Bedside Memorial & Procession of Honor

“We gather now to say goodbye . . .”

So begins the *Bedside Memorial & Procession of Honor* for a Carondelet Village resident who has died. Each family is told about this ritual to honor their loved one, led by the Campus Pastor and/or members of the Pastoral Care Team. There is spoken and sung prayer, sharing of memories, and a procession to the front doors. A family may choose to gather with just the family, or with the Carondelet Village community. In pre-COVID19 times, we would gather in the neighborhood where the person lived. For now, we live-stream the prayers from our Chapel on channel 990.

For those of you who are new to Carondelet Village (or if you have not yet participated but would like to) – we have a *Calling Tree* that is activated when a resident dies and the family wishes to have a *Bedside Memorial & Procession of Honor*. If you would like to have your name added to this list to be notified by phone when a resident dies and we are going to have this prayer service, please call the Pastoral Care office at *5011 and leave your name and phone number. We only call between the hours of 8:00am and 8:00pm. You will be told the name of the deceased, and the time prayers will be broadcast. Once we are able to gather again, you will be told where in the building that gathering will be.

Occasionally, a family will choose to gather with just the family. In that case, we do not do any calling.

I give thanks to God at every remembrance of you, always praying with joy for all of you . . .

I am so grateful to have been with you these past nine years. Every experience and encounter, whether joyful or sad, creative or confusing, kind or hurtful, affirming or negative, has taught me something. My time with you has been grace-filled, and a blessing that, I hope, went both ways. Thank you for being a part of my life. “All I ask of you is forever to remember me as loving you.” (Benedictine monks of Weston Priory)

My last day here is this Thursday, January 7th. I'd love an opportunity to say thank you and goodbye in person, so will be in the fireplace room next to the chapel from 1:00-2:00 Thursday afternoon, with a (Hershey's chocolate) hug for each of you. Do stop by if you have a minute!
